"Try Performance Driving in your Mercedes-Benz"

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Try Performance Driving in Your Mercedes-Benz

I've had my 1999 SL500 for about 3 years now and aspire to have the most fun possible with it. Part of that quest now includes performance driving, specifically autocross and track days. Most people would say the SL is not an ideal sports car, that it's more of a GT or Grand Turismo, designed to cover long distances at speed with style and comfort, and I suppose that's true.

But I've found that my SL, of the R129 generation, built from 1990 to 2001 has enough power and handling chops to make a decent showing, even against many modern cars. To prepare for more aggressive driving I've updated a few parts and checked everything over. Worn out shocks and struts were replaced with Bilsteins and brake lines, pads, fluid and tires were changed with suitable upgrades.

My first foray was to autocross, driving the car around a course outlined by orange cones, against the clock. A typical course will have 8-10 elements in different configurations: tight turns, long sweepers, or slaloms. The challenge is to follow the course through the sea of orange cones in the shortest time. Runs are typically in the 30 – 60 second range. The most competitive drivers may have years of experience and heavily modified Miatas, but there are so many novices in their street cars that there is competition at every level.

My local club, Tarheel Sports Car Club has an excellent novice program which provides classroom training, and in-car instruction from experienced drivers. Through this I've progressed to being confident in attacking the courses, and working on technique to improve, a second at a time. The events have usually over 100 cars and are very well run. It is rare to see another Mercedes-Benz, but I've seen a couple of C-class AMG's and an E63 AMG wagon. I've found the people to be, without exception friendly, welcoming and truly enthusiastic about driving and cars, and there is more than a bit of gray hair underneath the helmets. These events are safe, and unlikely to damage your car, except for increased tire wear. Though my car is quite heavy, the torque of the V8 engine and holding second gear, allows me to get around the course with some haste, if not grace. It is a real adrenaline rush, pushing to the absolute limit of traction, and beyond. Throughout the day, many cars will spin out, knock over cones, and earn penalties, part of the process of learning handling dynamics, and a bit of entertainment for spectators. Next up the scale is track days, in which an organization will rent a road course, and set up organized runs at full speed. Without the collision risks of wheel-to-wheel racing, the point is to learn how to handle your car at speed, optimizing steering inputs, braking and acceleration, combined with proper placement on the track for the fastest lap times.

Each run session is 15-20 minutes, or about 4 or 5 laps. Cars are grouped by driver experience, and passing is by "point-by" in places deemed safest. Preceding each event is a technical inspection looking for fluid leaks, loose parts, or cargo likely to fly around. At the track events, there are Corvettes and Mustangs, and many cars arriving in enclosed trailers full of tools and racing tires, however it is mostly low-key amateur racing with friends and families. A fair number of nearly stock sports cars and sedans are represented form Subaru, Hondas, Toyota, Porsche, and BMW.

Last month's bucket-list thrill for me was driving at triple-digit speeds around the banked oval at the Nascar track in Charlotte with Corvettes ahead and behind. MBCA has a couple of events each year, and there are a few national MBCA people who are fanatics for this sort of thing. Next I plan to attend a High Performance Driver Education (HPDE) event which includes classroom and in-car instruction on the high-speed tracks.

Through these events I've found a new appreciation for the capabilities of my car and learned how to drive it more skillfully. I highly recommend it for those interested. Contact me if you'd like to learn more, or come along.
